What comes to mind when you think of Lent? Some of us think about what we will abstain from, what we are giving up, whether that be chocolate or sweets or television or computer games. Some of us think about Lent as the 40 days before Easter, in which we dwell on the suffering and death of Jesus. Lent brings to mind a time of somber reflection.

The word Lent comes from a Latin word that means *spring*, as in the season of spring. The season of Lent itself began as the last intensive training in the early church before new Christians got baptized at the Easter Vigil.

Thinking about Lent through the eyes of spring and through the eyes of baptismal preparation provides a helpful corrective to the typical ways that we conceive of Lent. The practices of Lent are not meant to focus on suffering or on an attitude of somberness. Rather, Lent is meant to be a time to plant seeds with our spiritual practices. It is meant to be a time to reflect upon who we are called to be in our baptism.

This year we will focus on practices of prayer that each of us can do in order to connect ourselves more deeply with God. I often compare the importance of prayer with the importance of our relationships. When we are in a relationship with our spouse, friends, children or parents, we know that we need to both talk and listen. In the same way, when we are in a relationship with God, we also need to both talk and listen to God.

The problem that many of us have is that we think that there is only one way to be in prayer with God, whether that be a set prayer that we say or whether it be our shopping list of concerns that we present to God. Yet, there are many different practices of prayer, all of which can help us grow in our life of faith.

We will approach the subject and practice of prayer in three different ways this Lenten season.

First, during Sunday worship we will be speaking about how the practices of faith and prayer help our Christian walk. We will do this as we reflect upon the lessons and also pay attention to the book of Colossians. You will have an opportunity to get a devotional on Colossians that can further emphasize this theme.

Second, during our Adult Sunday Class, we will explore different practices of prayer, so that our prayer lives might stretch and grow. In these classes we will learn that prayer might incorporate the words of the church or of Scripture, but it also might use silence and centering.

Finally, in our Wednesday Lenten services we will hear from different members of Epiphany as they share how their practices of prayer have deepened their Christian faith. Come join us for all three of these opportunities and discover how you might broaden what prayer means to you.

Lent provides us an opportunity to grow in our spiritual practices. So, we invite you to join us in this Lenten season to grow in the practice of prayer.

Ring in the New Year with financial resolutions

With the New Year comes the opportunity to improve your financial well-being. Here are five financial resolutions to get you started:

1. Establish your 2016 financial goals, including your retirement and overall savings goals. Post them where you'll see them often.

2. Establish a budget based on what you spent last year, taking into account the variable prices of gas, heating and food.

3. Cut back on debt by paying off a credit card balance, foregoing unnecessary purchases or paying an additional amount each month to your mortgage payment.

4. Prioritize upcoming large purchases and figure out how to pay for them out of your current income.

5. Meet with a legal professional to review your will or estate strategy to ensure it reflects your current life situation.
