



Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

As we began this new year, I spoke of how we are centered this year on the theme:

Following the Way of Jesus

In this Easter season, we emphasize the theme of "Living the Way" as we explore what a new life in Christ means for us. We explore what the resurrection means for us as individuals and as a church. We remember that as Jesus was raised from the dead, so we have been raised to new life.

We often think of the resurrection only in terms of the future. We know that as Jesus was raised from the dead, so we all will be raised at the end of time. We know that in Jesus we have the promise that death is conquered. The promise that Jesus said to the thief on the cross is a promise to us: "Today you will be with me in Paradise." (Luke 23:43)

And these promises all are true. But we limit the power of the resurrection if we think about it for a life hereafter. The power of the resurrection comes with its promise of a life that begins here and continues after.

Paul connects the resurrection with the promises made in our baptism: "Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4)

Resurrection as newness of life means that we are not bound by our past any longer. We are not bound by sin any longer. We are not bound by those habitual patterns that held us back. We are not bound by the despair that we feel. All that is put to death through our baptism in the death of Jesus.

Resurrection as newness of life means that we are opened to God's future. We are opened to a life lived in grace and forgiveness. We are opened to new paths that lead to growth and wholeness. We are opened to hope, to justice, to peace, to love. As God raised Jesus, so God raises us to live in the Reign of God which God wishes to take hold of this earth.

So as we continue through these final weeks of Easter, let us together seek how God wishes to live among us. Let us declare with Paul: "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." (Galatians 1:19-20) Let us make our prayer and desire in this Easter season:

"Christ, Our Life, Raise Us."

And then as we move forward in this life, let us be open to the ways of the Spirit, the Spirit who came to the disciples at Pentecost and who wishes to sweep through us now as well.

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

FELLOWSHIP

The seasons of soup and sandwich suppers followed by worship services are now behind us for the rest of the church year. They will likely be resumed when Advent season comes around again. During the Lenten season, we had five such gatherings with an average participation of 27 persons fed with some fantastic food offerings and 30 gathering for worship. The weather was a bit less than ideal on two of the Wednesday evenings or the numbers may have been just a bit higher.

Since Fellowship's last Epistle entry we have had two more funeral receptions; one for a nonmember, Hoyt Dunn who was married to a member, Jan. That reception served a total of 57 and the majority of them were persons who worshiped on a golf course rather than at a church. The last reception served nearly 100 who gathered to remember and celebrate Mike Lanier. At both of those gatherings there was an ample amount of food and that which was not consumed was taken away, either by the donor or in to-go boxes which someone had donated months ago.

Current plans are to begin game nights in May – keep watch for announcements – which will provide more fellowship than food, but there will be drinks and snacks of some kind. At our next meeting, May 9th at 9:00 am in the library, the committee will be discussing what might transpire in the summer months. Come join us and share your thoughts.


GAME NIGHT

We had 60 seed packets sent off to Kentucky for the spring planting season. Thanks to all who donated to this effort.




All the gift bags for our donations to Project Renewal are ready to be delivered for Mother's Day.
