From Pastor David

As we get ready this month to vote in the Georgia primaries, I want to offer a few words about what it means to be faithful when it comes to politics.

Often people think that there is a separation between matters of faith and spirituality and matters of politics and public policy. But if faith means a whole-hearted commitment to God, then it will affect our political and social outlook along with our personal outlook.

On a recent 60 Minutes interview, Cardinal Czerny put it this way: “Life is political. It is not either political or non-political. It is political because life is political. Political is how we live together and how we face our problems together. We can’t be non-political. We don’t have to be partisan, but let’s not get confused between partisan and political means taking responsibility for our world and for its problems, especially as they affect those who are weakest. That is politics. Everybody is responsible for that.

“You don’t want to say this one party represents the church. Some will express this by being Republican, some by Democrat, and some independent or other options. The church’s position is we need to be responsible and act responsibly.”

Consider what Scripture tells us.

When the Mosaic Law proclaims, “You shall not wrong or oppress a resident alien, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt” (Exodus 22:21), it is being political.

When Amos declares, “Let justice roll down like water and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream” (Amos 5:24), he is being political.

When Micah declares, “He has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God” (Micah 6:8), he is being political.

And when Jesus tells us to feed the hungry, give water to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, visit those in sick or in prison, because “just as you did it to the least of these brothers or sisters of mine, you did it to me” (Matthew 25:40), he is being political.

The church is called to be political because matters of justice are matters of morality. Welcoming the immigrant is a matter of morality. Overcoming systemic racism is a matter of morality. Promoting the rights of the LGBTQ community is a matter of morality. Doing all we can to overcome gun violence in this country is a matter of morality. Making certain that health care is provided for all is a matter of morality. And working for peace are certainly matters of morality.

And may we never remain silent or complacent as a church or as a people.

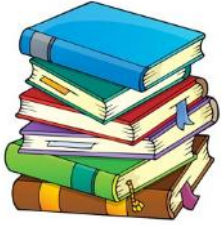

EveryStep Walking Fellowship Group

Greetings from the Every-step Walking Fellowship group! Join us every Thursday at 9:30. April 9th we walked to Mathew 15: 30-31. "And great crowds came to him, bringing with them the lame, the blind, the crippled, the mute, and many others, and they put them at his feet, and he healed them, so that the crowd wondered, when they saw the mute speaking, the crippled healthy, the lame walking, and the blind seeing." This scripture reminds us of Jesus healing power. We often wonder if healing miracles happen today. We know that many in healthcare currently have the desire and motivation to care for others and develop cures. Where does that desire come from? We know we cannot do anything without God. Pat Gibson in a previous meeting shared Dr. Marc Siegel book: *The Miracles Among Us* that presents stories demonstrating God's miracles still happen. The book is a good read.

Our health presentation was on the power of prayer for health and wellness. Did you know the Mayo Clinic and other scientists have conducted research on the effects of prayer? Prayers lower cortisol levels a marker of stress, decrease BP and heart rate, and improve the immune response. Prayer also decreases anxiety and depression by fostering a positive attitude and optimism. Nursing research indicates prayer with medication improves pain control compared to medication alone. Prayers can also lower alcohol consumption and are often part of recovery programs. A longitudinal study found those with chronic illnesses praying daily were 1.5 to 1.7 times more likely to survive over a 6-year period. Studies indicate praying to God 12 minutes a day, especially combined with meditation, incorporating deep breathing, muscle relaxation, visualization, and stillness improve cognition. Prayer connects the mind, body, and spirit. Parental words of wisdom when things happened back-in-the-day still applies, "Have you prayed about it?" Younger people today exclaim, "Stay Prayed Up!"

Council Meeting Minutes - April

Group convened in rooms 7-9 at 11:30 am. In attendance: Pastor David Armstrong-Reiner, Vice-President Anita Smith, Secretary Riki DeLamar, Lane Carlisle, Deidre London, Tim Lohr, Julia Mumford, Michael Thompson, and guests Don Harris and Gillie. The Group enjoyed a meal and had sharing time.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 12:00 PM by Anita Smith.

Minutes of Previous Meeting: The Minutes from the previous meeting were distributed via email and reviewed independently. Deidre summarized them for those who hadn't had a chance to review them. No corrections or changes requested. Motion made to accept as presented by Julia Mumford. Seconded by Michael Thompson. Motion carried.

Agenda: The agenda for today's meeting was presented and reviewed. Motion was made to accept the agenda as presented with the addition of HVAC as item number 4 under old business by Anita Smith. Motion was seconded by Riki DeLamar. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORTS:

1. FINANCIAL SECRETARY
2. TREASURER

Total Operating income for March was \$36,526.72 with \$3,007.50 in designated funds. Total expenses were \$32,608.15.

We were reminded that though we were in the black for March 2026, January and February both had a deficit. Tracy has been doing the reporting on-line from Wisconsin. Anita has been processing the payroll from her house. This seems to be working well. Anita needs to be added as a signatory on the Operations Banking account now that Tracy will only be here occasionally. Motion made to accept the financial reports by Lane Carlisle. Seconded by Deidre London. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

No written report.

Pastor will be presenting a paper at a conference in Denver later in the year on his book of Revelation series of paintings. Vicar James' ordination will be on Saturday, May 2 at All Saints Lutheran Church in Lilburn. Michael asked about the time capsule (we still need to decide where it is going and do an installation).

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Synod delegates – Synod assembly is May 28-30 in Columbus. Pastor Mary will be our female delegate, but we still need a male delegate to represent the congregation.
2. Music Director Search – Julia has re-distributed the information about looking for a new organist. She sent the flyer to 10 colleges with music programs last week as well as the Organ Guild and the Synod.
3. Endowment Disbursements - Disbursements recommended by the Endowment Committee were approved, but the transfer of the funds will not happen until we are actually ready to spend the money (or send the donation).
4. HVAC – We had 3 quotes for a new HVAC system – from Henderson, Colonial, and Reliance. We have received designated funds of \$2438.31 and have an amount from the Endowment Committee has been earmarked for this project. We selected the quote that was in the middle in relation to cost (\$9807 from Reliance). The system they will be installing is from Carrier, which is a very reputable manufacturer. We will use the designated funds first, and if necessary, plan to cover the remaining amount out of the Endowment Disbursement. We anticipate this will leave us some remaining funds to be used for other matters.

Council Meeting Minutes - April

NEW BUSINESS:

Treasurer Position – Today was Tracy’s last day. She has indicated she is willing to fulfil the position remotely. She will be back a couple times a year in person as she still has family in the area. We are going to continue with this for now.

REPORTS:

PRESIDENT – No written report.

VICE PRESIDENT – No written report.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORTS:

1. Discipleship (Abby Harper) – No written report.

2. Outreach (Tim Lohr, Diedre London, Anita Smith) – See written report. Hunger Walk raised \$2701.00. Elks Aidmore Easter Egg project raised \$1156.00 for 24 baskets – enough that each girl had one. Even though we had more girls this year! Meals on Wheels has added another stop! Youth Group is having their first cooking class today. Next session will be 5/3/26. Deidre is having conversations about adding Bible Study/Sunday School with Bob Ard. Room 10 is being set up for the teens. They are looking for donations of appliances and furniture. If we can get more participation, Deidre would like to add a young adult group also. The men of Epiphany will be hosting breakfast on Mother’s Day in honor of all of our Women!

3. Nurture (Riki DeLamar)– No written report. I apologize that I did not have a written report. Was not aware I had Nurture again. Everyone in charge of the various Nurture Programs. I will be reaching out to you next month for reports about a week before the meeting (Furman, Pastor, Evelyn, Terri, Denise, Julie). Meal delivery to Doris Webb has been completed. Thank you to all who assisted with that! The Devotion Series for Lent went a little longer than anticipated, but we took it all the way through Easter. THANK YOU to all who participated!! We have so many talented people in our congregation! If you have favorite passages or verses, or thoughts, send them to me and I will save them – we will be doing this again!

4. Administration (Peggy Lawrence, Greg Holcomb, and Julia Mumford.) – No written report. Julia has set up a service to process electronic giving called Zeffy. Vanco has been our processor for many years, but they charge a percentage off of every offering. Zeffy doesn’t charge anything. They rely on goodwill by the user to be willing to voluntarily add a small amount for administrative costs. Discussed possibly moving to Stripe for the rental income processing for the same reason. Our website hasn’t had any overhauls or significant changes since Greg Potratz did it several years ago. Probably nearing a decade. It needs addressing. Julia will reach out to Terri Lange who has been doing this since he left (as well as Facebook). We have several ‘electronic housekeeping’ items that need attention. Policies need updating, The Constitution and Bylaws need reviewing. Child Protection Policies need to be updated and training renewed. Discussion about building access and keys. Is there a master list of who has keys? Pastor advised to start with Valerie. Tim asked if anyone knew the resolution on the Lennar Sign situation. The signage issue/payment issue needs to be followed up on. Pastor advised he would do this.

5. Worship (Lane Carlisle) – No written report.

The May Council Meeting will be held as a Zoom meeting due to multiple conflicts. Tuesday the 19th at 7 pm. Mark your calendars!

Julia Mumford made a Motion to adjourn and was carried. Session closed with the Lord’s Prayer.
