

#### From Pastor David

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

Christ is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

This Sunday we begin the celebration of Easter, of God raising Jesus from the dead. We "unbury" our Alleluias and let our praise for God's wonderful work sound forth.

And as we do so, let us remember that what we proclaim in the resurrection is about something more than the resuscitation of a body. What we proclaim in Easter is not about some sort of "evidence that demands a verdict." Rather the proclamation of Easter is a matter of faith. The promise of Easter is about an inner reality that calls us to believe and trust in the God who raised Jesus.

When we proclaim, "Christ is Risen!", we proclaim that sin does not have the last word. When we are overwhelmed by the addictive behaviors that afflict us, we remind ourselves of this victory. In the cross of Jesus our old self – bound by sin and habit – has been put to death, so that we are raised with Jesus into a new life of love and service. As Paul writes to the Galatians, "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." (Galatians 2:19-20)

Sin does not have the last word. God's grace and forgiveness does!

When we proclaim, "Christ is Risen!", we proclaim that injustice does not have the last word. When we despair at the gun violence that claims more innocent lives, when we see the poison of racism and homophobia that still seek to clutch at power through educational or immigration policies, we remind ourselves that in Christ we have a promise that we can live by. The powers of the world inflicted upon Jesus the most cruel and inhumane death known for a political criminal, so that when God raised Jesus from the dead, God confirms Jesus as the one "anointed to bring good news to the poor ... sent ... to proclaim release to the captives ... to let the oppressed go free." (Luke 4:18)

Injustice doe not have the last word. God's justice and peace does!

When we proclaim, "Christ is Risen!", we proclaim that death does not have the last word. When we grieve at the death or illness of a loved one, we remember that hope and life is found in the Easter promise. The tomb could not contain Jesus. The powers of death have been broken. As Paul declares to the Corinthians: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? ... But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Corinthians 15:54-55, 57)

Death does not have the last word. God's life in a "love that comes from eternity and leads toward eternity" (Bonhoeffer) does!

So, let us lift up our Alleluias! Let us raise our voice in praise to our God! And then let us live in and by the grace and justice and life that this Easter declares!

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

Christ is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

#### Vision Endowment Fund Update

Does everyone remember Epiphany has an Endowment Fund? The fund was established in 2016 after a bequest from the estate of Ona Lester. Since then, there have been additional donations following the deaths of Bob Lange and Frank Zahm. Every year, distributions are made from the fund to support non -budgeted ministries outside and within Epiphany, and to provide for other needs.

Before reporting the distributions for 2024, we would like to thank Bill Schroeder for his many years of service to the Endowment team. Bill has served two full 3-year terms on the committee and an additional year completing the term of a previous member. Bill was the chair of the committee for the past 4 years. He will be missed, but has earned a well-deserved retirement from that role.

The distributions for 2024 have been determined. As described in the By-laws to the church constitution by which the fund is administered, 5% of the balance of the fund as of December 31 is distributed the following year. On December 31, 2023 the balance of the fund was \$275,168, so \$13,758 will be distributed in 2024. The By-laws also define categories where funds should be used; 20% of the distribution goes to the community, 20% to ELCA Churchwide ministries, 20% to special programs/capital improvements or other congregation ministries, and the final 40% to any of the above.

The Endowment Committee recommendation for 2024 distributions was approved by the Church Council and is as follows (rounded to the nearest dollar):

- \$2,752 to community organizations. This year, we will be donating to Inspiritus (formerly called Lutheran Services of Georgia), Grace House (a ministry to students at Georgia Tech in Atlanta), Rockdale Emergency Relief, Phoenix Pass (a shelter for women and children), and the Help Line (a fund at Epiphany to help those in need)
- \$2,752 to the Southeastern Synod of the ELCA
- \$8,255 to help pay for a new sound system, pay for security and fire safety improvements, pay for Epiphany's share of cost (\$2,000) to provide for an intern who will join us later in the year, and if any funds are left, to pay for conversion of more lights to LEDs.

We are able to support these ministries and projects because of past generous donations to Epiphany from individuals' estates and memorials. Please prayerfully consider how you may further help this important ministry. If you have any questions, please contact Pastor David or Bryan Peterson.

Our next project will be involving Project Renewal in May.








#### **WOMEN'S BOOK CLUB**





#### Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order @ 11:30 AM. In attendance were Pastor David, Peggy Lawrence, Michael Thompson, Anita Smith, Tim Lohr, Kathy Roston, new council members: Riki DeLamar, Abby Harper, Deidre London, Nancy Stover, Pat Viohl, Sheila Sipe and guests Furman Rogers and Bruce Hefner.

#### Agenda:

The agenda for today's meeting was presented and reviewed with the addition of a presentation from Bruce Hefner about the property (listed under New Business), and the addition of an Update on the Lennar Homes Sign under Old Business, and an update on the churchwide assembly. Motion to accept the agenda as presented with the additions. Motion was seconded and carried.

After a blessing offered by President Peggy Lawrence, the group enjoyed a meal while listening to Bruce Hefner.

We have multiple water issues with the property. With the rook, with the vents in the sanctuary, with the french drain, with the gutters and drains coming from the roof. Our insurance company Bitner Henry Brotherhood Mutual will be coming out this week to do an inspection, and hopefully we will be able to make a claim. There are also several maintenance issues throughout the building that have been identified, and several lights that need replacing.

Operating income for February was \$19,552.52 with \$823. in designated funds. Total expenses were \$21,226.82. Anita Smith advised that she and Tracy Parker have been doing 'account maintenance', there are still designated funds assigned in areas of the plan that are more related to them. We are also moving towards getting this process more automated, and less likely to be affected by human error. Motion made to accept this report as submitted by Michael Thompson and seconded by Pat Viohl. Motion carried.
