

From Pastor David

"When I called, you answered me; You increased my strength within me." (Psalm 138:3)

What is prayer?

Sometimes people think that prayer is something that pastors do, as if ordination passes on the correct words and proper tone and inflections. We do this whenever we assume that only the pastor can bless a meal or give an invocation.

Growing up, I was helped in my understanding of prayer by my mother, who taught me that prayer is simply a conversation with God. Just as my relationships with family and friends grows only as I communicate with them, so my relationship with God grows in the same way.

Understanding prayer as communication also means that I am called to listen as much as I talk. Such listening can happen in silence or in reading Scripture or in gathering with the faithful in worship or study.

In my further growth in prayer, I have come to understand prayer as not only communication but also as a communing with God. Prayer means that I root myself in God, seeking to be shaped by the God who loves me and sees the child of God that I am and the child of God that I can become.

When I see prayer as such communion, I am moved away from prayer as a <u>transactional</u> approach, where I present God my requests and desires and God then answers them. Rather, prayer is <u>transformational</u>, becoming the person that God calls me to be.

As one example, Psalm 138 offers this transformational approach. The psalmist in his need does not ask God to solve his problems. He asks God for increased strength to face what might come his way. What would happen if we similarly pray each day, "O God, increase my strength within me."

As another example, Jesus offers simple words when the disciples ask how to pray. These words that we pray each Sunday and that many of us pray each day show us how God calls us to be and for the strength to face what might come our way. So, I invite you to dwell on these words and how they might shape our faith and our life:

Our Father in heaven – not just my God, but the God of all who live;

Hallowed be your name – help me know how you are beyond my understanding; Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven – give me the understanding to know your will and the strength to live from that will;

Give us this day our daily bread – Give me what I need not what I want, and help me to work that everyone's needs are provided;

And forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us – Help me to forgive as you forgive, help me to love as you love;

And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil – Give me the strength to face whatever trials might come my way;

For the kingdom and the power and the glory are yours now forever – You alone are the source of all my strength.

Amen.

As they enter into full adult participation within the church, we pray that God will continue to strengthen their faith in both of their lives.




